

**Stow-Munroe Falls Athletic Booster Meeting
February 21, 2007**

President Chuck Obendorf called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. Review of minutes with one change, Chili Open date is March 10th. Tom Harrell motioned and Ed Ferencz seconded the minutes be approved. Motion carried unanimously.

Treasurer's Report – See attached report for detail. We received \$1,160 in donations in memory of past Booster President James Powers. Kim will send thank you's. We still have our big fundraisers coming up. We can't charge for districts parking anymore per OSHA. We should be able to charge for parking for volleyball regionals.

Concession inventory has a lot of coke products, PowerAde and candy items left. Kathy Maruna said there will a wrestling open tournament and perhaps they could use some of it to sell at the open.

Committee Reports –

Membership – K. Maruna reported that we've reached 300 members. We handed out forms at Spotlight on Stow and can also have forms available at the Spring Sports Parents meeting which is March 5th. Congrats to Kathy – this is the highest membership ever!!!

Advertising – T. Harrell reported that we're still collecting advertising money. Part of the slow collection is from the winter sports advertising. We may need to re-look at the advertising table and how those advertisers are billed and decide are we better off with or without the table. D. Gaydos suggested that Eric @ Print Digital might be a good source.

Night at the Races – K. Berlan reported that the date is Friday, April 20th at 6:00 p.m. at the SYB Hall. Forms are available in the back to pass out. This year we're adding 5 tables for a total of 55 tables of 8. Penny and Kim will handle the Silent Auction. It was a sell out last year. Coaches Reports –

Basketball – Senior night was very emotional. We've won 9 out of our last 11 games and made lots of progress. We're looking forward to the play-offs which start next Tuesday in Copley.

Wrestling – We ended up as co-WRC champions. 1st time ever at Stow. We came in 5th in the Sectionals and are sending 6 wrestlers to Districts, where the top 4 will advance to the State Tournament. It's been a great year! We hope to get at least one to the State Tournament.

We're hosting a youth tournament on April 14th. We may be able to buy some of the left over concession items to sell at the tourney.

Weight Room – Currently has softball, lacrosse and track lifting after school so it's a busy place right now.

Swimming – We have 5 individuals going to State; one relay and 2 individuals. The state meet is this weekend. We've broke 3 school records this year.

Bowling – Last Sat. we placed 3rd in Sectionals. There were 31 teams with the top 16 advancing and top 6 individuals. Our boys bowling went 15 – 6 for 2nd place and girl's bowling 14- 7 for 3rd place.

Athletic Director's Report –

There will be conference passes sold so you can go to any game home or away within the conference – We're not sure of the price yet.
