The Chili Open made \$2,000 which will help with the weight room renovations.

We will continue to add to these monies as donations come in and every fundraiser we have we will put 10- 15% off the top to the BCS project. Until we reach 80% of the amount needed we can't break ground and start the project. But it is only on hold until the monies are raised.

The new fry trailer will be ready for the Reinhart Relays. The old trailer was sold to Camper City for \$2,000. We kept the freezer and refrigerator.

The Village Pizza fundraiser profit was \$2,800.
